

On 19th July the Government are proposing that all Covid restrictions are relaxed. Although it is inevitable that at some time we must all return to normal, at Grimston Medical Centre we will still have the need to keep some restrictions in place. We have considered this for some time and hope that you can understand our position.

A View from Lanky Hill

I am writing this last article before the summer break, over the weekend of 17th/18th July. The days are just beginning to shorten, which usually means they are also about to warm up – any temperatures over 24/25°C are not welcome to me (as some of you well know!). I've had a couple of excursions, one to Tilney All Saints, attending the funeral of an old rugby friend. After the service we all gathered at the Coach and Horses pub where old times and matches were replayed over and over again - I didn't do much the next day for the obvious reason. But more will be told of our old friend who died at the grand age of 81. Another trip was to Ringstead to collect two or three score of leek plants, to be planted where the early spuds had been lifted (didn't I bring you any?). Everywhere I've been I've noticed, on waste ground and roadside verges, an abundance of Ragwort. This yellow flowered plant is a perennial (known also as Stinking Willie) and not liked by farmers as, when cut and dried, the foliage is poisonous to livestock. Left to grow into late summer, the flowers attract an insect which lays eggs inside the flower petal and hatch into green and yellow caterpillars, much loved by Finches and Warblers. It's an ill wind that benefits nobody.

I think the Ragwort is early this year, normally more often seen in August, along with another perennial weed, Purple Flowering Willow Herb, which is not as yet evident. Any botanist reading this who can supply the reason please contact me (01553 636394). Now is the time to review the avian population of the garden here at Lanky Hill Our old friends, the House Martins, are now well into their second brood of youngsters. Numbers are down this year due to their late arrival and cold dry May. No more than ten nests can be counted. The decision by Sharon to place a few bird feeders at the front of the house, tucked in between the front porch and the dining room window, has been a wonderful success. Sheltered from attack by Sparrow Hawks (not that I've seen one this year), a veritable explosion of small birds queue up to feed. Sitting, as I do, in the snug, I can watch them at my leisure. Four breeds of Tits – Blue, Great, Long Tailed and Coal, compete for peanuts. On the feeders containing sunflower hearts many types of Warblers and other summer visitors can be observed; I'm not a good enough ornithologist to name but a few, but certainly Blackcaps, Chiff Chaffs and Wood Warblers are present. .Going up a size, Blackbirds are most common, mostly feeding on the bread and Tesco's scones put out on the back lawn every morning. Again, upping a size, are Wood Pigeons.

Not this year attacked by any Sparrow Hawks, they seem to be everywhere. A pair have built a nest on top of the Aga chimney, right above our bedroom.

Sleep at this time of year is impossible after 5.00am – whether a week day or weekend, as they ceaselessly "coo-coo" to one another.

Our biggest and shyest visitor this summer has been a Red Kite, with its forked tail is instantly recognizable. They feed on carrion and I wondered what attracted this marvellous hawk to us. However, looking through the back hedge is a rather gappy field of sugar beet (drilled too early). A colony of rabbits are there to be found These have contacted "myxie" and their corpses have attracted the Kite. They are obviously nesting in Congham Woods, the other side of the Massingham Road.

Sharon has just returned from filling up the bird feeders in the back garden and announced that, for the third day in a row, the Goldfinches are absent. This reminded me of July last year, so I drove up to Tythe Farm and up to the top of Lanky Hill where I found a large flock of Goldfinches feeding on Thistle heads which had just seeded. I find this amazing, to fly several hundred meters from where they live in relative safety just to feed on what is a natural food for them. At least my expense has been momentarily spared.

I'm going to finish this month with some memoirs of old friends and acquaintances. Please excuse me if some of these memoirs cause a little offence!! Firstly, as earlier mentioned, I recently attended the funeral of an old rugby colleague, Melvin Wiles. He lived all his life down Eau Brink, a remote lane between Tilney and St Germans. He earned his living providing kennels for dogs and horses, which, on his retirement, he sold to the RSPCA. Melvin, as a young man, was an amateur boxer, who was persuaded to turn professional. This proved quite successful until one day it occurred to him that his manager was earning more than he was. The main problem was, of course, when the bell rang for the start of the fight the manager, despite all assurances of support, got out of the ring, leaving Melvin to do the hard and often painful work! After his retirement he still, once a year, attended King's Lynn "Mart" where he took on the resident champion. Quickly knocking out the poor chap, he soon had the job for himself. Most of his opponents were worse the wear for drink, so a quick tap on the chin was sufficient for victory. All cash and no manager – very satisfactory.Melvin was quite a character, hence a full church at his funeral on July 13th this year.

Another well know King's Lynn character was from a generation earlier. Most of you will know the fishmongers in Austin Fields called Donaldsons. Half a century ago, Jack Donaldson had his shop in Norfolk Street, just opposite where W.H.Smith and the Post Office is today, supplied daily by the King's Fishing Fleet in North Lynn. Jack lived with his family in Nursery Lane, North Wootton. Despite running a very efficient and successful business Jack was very fond of a daily tipple during the day at "Fiddaman's" opposite his shop (now closed) or the Red Cat Public House (still open) in North Wootton. At the Red Cat he and his best mate, George Goddard, would entertain the locals with stories, mostly lurid and rude to the extreme. I remember my parents, when they lived in North Wootton, would attend on Saturday night and find themselves amused.

, Two of Jack's stories I will now relate. The Thompson family lived in the Grange close to the pub and the church. Mrs Vera Thompson on Friday decided that her husband Wilfred would enjoy a fillet of plaice for his supper. Phoning Jack at the shop, the order was placed which he would deliver on his way home. The fish was placed on Jack's driving seat by his staff. Leaving "Fiddaman's" Jack, rather the worse for drink, drove home to North Wootton, just remembering in time to call in at the Grange and deliver Wilfred's plaice. Driving into the Grange, Vera was pruning roses outside the front door. Jack drove up to Mrs Thompson and looked around for the plaice fillets. Too late a sudden dampness to the seat of his trousers made him realise where the parcel was. Getting out of his truck he handed over Wilfred's supper and beat a hasty retreat. Whether Wilfred ever ate his plaice supper will remain a mystery: remember, Jack had spent all afternoon drinking several pints of beer at "Fiddaman's".


Pott Row Methodist Chapel August Services

Pets Corner

This month I want to talk a bit about raw diets that has been very popular amongst pet owners recently. If you have chosen to feed your pet on raw food, you should be aware of the potential problems.

What are the benefits?

- You are in control of the ingredients.
- No preservatives or additives.
- Some people enjoy preparing meals for their pet

Economy should not be a reason to ccok for your pet, as commercial diets are normally cheaper and more balanced than home-cooked diets.

Are raw diets balanced?

Studies have shown that the majority of raw diets are not balanced or complete, but your pet may not immediately show symptoms of deficiency if he/she is older. It is the young growing puppy or kitten that will show deficiencies the easiest. I can distinctly remember a kitten that I treated that had fractures of his pelvis because the owner fed him just raw mince, and that led to an imbalance between the calcium and phosphorous in his body to the extent that his bones did not mineralised and fractured.

It is natural, but is it safe?

Studies on commercial raw foods has shown that they are often contaminated with pathogens like Salmonella, Campylobacter, Yersinia and other bacteria that can cause upset tummies in both pets and humans. These bacteria are also excreted in the stool of the pet and can contaminate the environment, as well as the owner that handles the raw meat or picks up the stool. Other parasites that can lurk in raw food are Toxoplasma, Sarcocystis, Neospora caninum, Toxocara canis (roundworms) and tapeworms. They all have the potential to infect humans as well, sometimes with devastating effects on the health of the human. Certain viruses like Norovirus, Psuedorabies and Avian Influenza (cats being fed infected poultry) can also be transmitted from your pet fed on raw meat to you.

People at risk

Any person with a compromised immune system is at risk of catching above diseases from either the pet or handling of the raw diet. These are the elderly, pregnant women, children under 5 years of age, people undergoing treatment for cancer or has an immunosuppressive disease. In short: all those people that we class as 'highly vulnerable' for Coronavirus. Bear in mind that some people working in the veterinary field can also fall in this category, and therefore if you feed your pet a raw diet, please tell your veterinary practice so that these people can take precautions when handling your pet.

Does feeding raw bones help your pet's teeth?

The short answer: no. Dogs certainly enjoy chewing on bones, but it will not lead to clean teeth. Chewing on bones may reduce tartar, but not periodontitis, which is what leads to rotten teeth. Furthermore, the amount of calcium in the bones are not enough for keeping your dog healthy. Another point to remember is that if the bone is hard enough to scrape off tartar, it is hard enough to break a tooth. Swallowed pieces of bones can damage the intestines and may need to be surgically removed if they get stuck.



Deworm your pet regularly. And please tell your vet that you are feeding a raw diet when your pet develops a runny tummy.






